ATTENDANCE and PUNCTUALITY

Daily school attendance is important for all children and young people to succeed in education and to ensure they don't fall behind both socially or developmentally. Children and young people who regularly attend school and complete Year 12 or an equivalent qualification have better health outcomes, better employment outcomes, and higher incomes across their lives. It is important that children develop habits of regular attendance at an early age.

School participation is important as it maximises life opportunities for children and young people by providing them with education and support networks. School helps people to develop important skills, knowledge and values which set them up for further learning and participation in their community.

Punctuality is also a key contributor to your child's development and welfare. It can be quite distressing for a child to enter a classroom late to find their peers already on task. Not only is it difficult for the child it is also disruptive to the class and teacher who then needs to repeat instructions to the late student. While we understand that this is sometimes unavoidable it should not become a habit. Unfortunately in recent weeks we have a number of parents who are dropping their children off late but not accompanying them into school.

If you do drop your child at school late we ask that you either sign them in at the office or call us to advise of their late arrival.
